1.0 Introduction

The Upper San Joaquin River Region encompasses the areas that are protected by the State Plan of Flood Control Facilities along the San Joaquin River from Gravelly Ford to the confluence of the Merced River. The *Upper San Joaquin River Regional Flood Management Plan* (RFMP) identifies high-priority solutions for regional flood risk reduction that are economically viable and implementable. The RFMP for the Upper San Joaquin River Region identifies and articulates the flood management challenges and deficiencies at the regional level, as well as the potential actions and projects identified by local agencies and interest groups for the region. Project prioritization will illustrate the benefits of the projects. Project costs will be estimated and financial strategies identified for potential funding sources.

It is important that the RFMP reflects the shared understanding and recommendations of the stakeholders as well as coordinates with other San Joaquin River RFMPs. The Coordination and Collaboration (C&C) Plan defines the purpose, strategy, and actions for engaging with key audiences of the RFMP. Coordination activities include development of RFMP information materials for meetings with stakeholders.

2.0 Communication Goals

Communication goals for the RFMP include:

- Develop awareness among local flood management agencies and stakeholders of participation opportunities in the development of the Upper San Joaquin River RFMP.
- Develop communication partnerships with allied organizations and government agencies to further the goals of the RFMP.
- Ensure socially and culturally relevant outreach to stakeholders.
- Collaborate effectively and efficiently with other FloodSAFE programs.
- Collaborate effectively and efficiently with other San Joaquin River RFMPs.
- Create opportunities for public input and engagement.

COMMUNICATION GOALS

3.0 Principles

Three core principles guide the C&C approach for this project:

- **Critical Path Effort** C&C activities directly link to key critical path project tasks, including development of RFMP plan and prioritization of projects.
- Efficiency Outreach will be succinct and efficient (a "less-is-more" philosophy).
- **High Leverage and High Utility** Activities will be highly focused on leveraging support among multiple project goals. Project collateral and approaches will be oriented to high utility, meaning the materials developed for one use can be reused for other purposes. Each meeting will have a focus on a specific project task.



4.0 Action Steps

Many documents have information relevant to the RFMP. The Project Team will assist stakeholders in understanding what kinds of data are needed in addition to what already has been collected for other flood management programs.

Coordination activities during this period include:

Communication Activities

- Confirm and activate the RFMP Web site that will be used to disseminate stakeholder workshop information.
- Conduct the RFMP kickoff planning meeting and two additional planning meetings.
- Coordinate with the Lower and Mid-San Joaquin RFMP efforts.
- Conduct and facilitate 10 public workshops to discuss RFMP report sections during development of the report (see the schedule in Appendix A for meeting purpose and timing).
- Provide meeting summaries in follow-up e-mail to agency contacts.
- Expand the outreach effort to support the regionwide information gathering process by conducting the following activities:
 - Update the RFMP Web site and information materials to ensure that the most current information is available.
 - Plan and coordinate one-on-one meetings, or small group briefings, between RFMP team representatives and key organizations, as needed.
- Use the products to be discussed and the desired level of input requested to determine the format of interactions with different audiences.
- Organize a range of engagement activities, depending on the project needs:
 - Interviews and Information Gathering On-the-ground interactions with key flood and water management agencies to gather and verify information
 - Briefings Tailored status updates to key audiences
 - Workshops Workshops to gather input on key flood issues, ideas, recommendations, or concepts with the stakeholder audience

6.0 **Openness and Accountability**

Conducting public engagement in an open and accountable way involves a number of specific logistical steps in meeting organization and facilitation. The following practices will be followed in the RFMP Coordination process.

- Advance Notification of Meeting Times, Locations, and Agendas Stakeholders and interested parties will be given adequate advance notice of the times, locations, and agendas of all public meetings to ensure that these groups can participate fully.
- Web Posting of Meeting Agendas and Materials Web posting of meeting agendas and meeting materials makes it easier for stakeholders and interested parties to remain engaged in the ongoing process, especially a process that deals with a large geographical area.
- **Neutral Facilitation** Meeting facilitators will assure an open process where all participants' interests, views, and opinions are heard and thoughtfully considered. All input will be recorded in an unbiased manner. This requirement does not preclude facilitators from enforcing agreed-upon ground rules for group participation.
- **Production of Publicly Available Meeting Summaries** Written summaries of meetings form a useful public record of meeting proceedings and enable participants who miss occasional meetings to remain informed about what has occurred.
